DPW/Water Report: Results from the new test passed and the water report was fine.

Kevin Denton stated 95% of the CHIPS projects are completed. The shoulders on Trout Pond Road, Center lines on new roads and lines in front of the Town Hall are left to do.

The water tank was inspected - no report yet.

The 2017 Dump truck is at Clarks for 3 different error codes, 2 censors have been fixed and one is on backorder.

Supervisor Monty stated he received an email from Steve Shaffer about the possibility of changing a yield sign to a stop sign at the end of Brainards Forge Road.

The Board discussed hiring someone per diem to complete projects they used to have inmates do. Supervisor Monty stated there is money in DPW budget, and it would be an as needed position at minimum wage with no benefits.

A motion was made to hire an as needed employee at minimum wage with no benefits by Dave Blades and seconded by Steve Denton, 0 opposed, motion carried.

Counselor Scott asked what the cap would be on the per diem employee, Counselor Blades suggested up to \$1000.00

A motion was made to amend the motion to hire an as needed employee at minimum wage with no benefits to include up to \$1000.00 by Dave Blades and seconded by Jeff Scott, 0 opposed, motion carried.

Guests: Diana Sweatt stated she has received 2 grants from the Center of the Arts and will be holding a photo contest and wanted to know if she could display the photos on the fence at the Town Park for a week up to 10 days. She also stated she received money for informative signs that could be displayed on the trails at Thrall Dam.
