DPW will also be looking at resurfacing a couple spots on the Hyde Road and maybe Trout Pond Road.

Reseeding will be done on spots where water meters were installed last year.

a. Single Audit CDBG grant – Audit is in process, they were here last week auditing 2018 and 2019. Once the Audit is complete the Town will have a good picture of finances. Supervisor Monty stated they seemed happy with everything and the audit is a mandated as part of the grant funding.

New Business:

- 1. Codes Report Mike Flynn gave a codes report, he had 6 permits in May and 3 in April
- 2. Animal Control Report Supervisor Monty reported a dog was seized from the Trailer Park after reports from neighbors of a dog left unattended in a cage, a citation was issued and owners did not show up to court, a warrant was issued and the dog was taken to the shelter.
- 3. Youth Commission Meeting Minutes A grant will be used to bus children for the Summer Program. Academic programs will be added to the summer program this year. They are still moving forward with the Food Program. A motion was made to accept the Youth Commission Meeting Minutes by Lanita Canavan and seconded by Jeff Scott.
- 4. Abandon a Part of Hale Hill Road Supervisor Monty reported the Town has been approached by the owner of the Missile Silo, asking if the Board would consider abandoning part of the Road by the Birch Mill Office, he would like to install a gate. Supervisor Monty stated leases will be honored for hunters, a key will be available to the Fire Department and the town would lose ¼

- mile of highway inventory. Supervisor Monty stated he asked for a formal request in writing and the resident would have to come present his request to the Board.
- 5. RFP for new signs The board discussed using part of the \$20,000.00 the Town received from Roost to purchase new signs. A motion was made to RFP designs by Dave Blades and seconded by Lanita Canavan, 0 opposed, motion carried.
- Materials to finish the bridge at Thrall A motion was made to take \$4000.00 out of Roost
 Tourism funds to purchase materials to finish the bridge at Thrall by Jeff Scott and seconded by
 Dave Blades, 0 opposed, motion carried.
- Pomeroy Sign Joe Call Supervisor Monty gave permission to have a Legends and Lore
 Markers sign installed at 3 Osawentha Drive should funding be received from the William G.
 Pomeroy Foundation.

Counselor Canavan suggested hiring a temporary Laborer to address issues such as the wall in front of the Town Hall and trimming hedges. To work on an as needed basis.

A motion was made to audit and pay the bills by Dave Blades and seconded by Lanita Canavan, 0 opposed, motion carried.
